What is Open Access?

Open Access (OA) is a movement to provide public access to scholarship (such as peer reviewed journal articles) and enable its reuse through alternative licensing. OA is achieved by **article archiving** and by **publishing in open access journals**. OA helps readers by providing access to more research, and helps authors by generating more views, downloads, and citations.

Open Access Services at Virginia Tech

-  **Subvention Fund:** faculty and graduate students can apply for funding to cover article processing charges in open access journals (funds provided by the Provost's Office and the University Libraries).
-  **Publishing Discounts:** the University Libraries has memberships with many open access journal publishers, resulting in reduced article processing charges.
-  **Journal Publishing:** Interested in starting an academic journal or transitioning your society's journal to open access? The University Libraries can provide the software and support, and already hosts more than 20 journals.
-  **VTechWorks:** archive your journal articles, presentations, reports, audio and video in the university's institutional repository to provide for greater access and preservation.
-  **Copyright Guidance:** get help from the Libraries with publishing agreements, class use of materials, and ETDs.
